(Battle through the difficult times, attach yourself to an out-going friend, show no fear in the face of teasing, excel in sport, ...) What help did you receive? A speech pathologist, a friend who didn't care if you stuttered, a helpful teacher . . . If you could go back to that time, and face that child, struggling to say what (s)he needed to, what would you say to them?
